Arthur Snow is Professor in Economics at the Terry College of Business of the University of Georgia, where he has been on the faculty since 1986. He has a B.A. from Harvard University and an M.A. and a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin. His research has



received a number of awards and has been published amongst others in the *Journal of Public Economics*, *Economics Letters*, the *Journal of Political Economy*, the *International Economic Review*, the *Journal of Macroeconomics*, the *Journal of Risk and Insurance*, the *Journal of Risk and Uncertainty*, the *Southern Economic Journal*, the *Geneva Papers on Risk and Insurance Theory*, and the *Journal of Economic Theory*. He is an associate editor of the *Geneva Risk and Insurance Review* and currently president of the European Group of Risk and Insurance Economists (EGRIE).

Arthur Snow's research interests are in the areas of microeconomic theory, economics of information and uncertainty and public economics.

From July 10, 2011 to July 15, 2011 he will be visitor at the Munich Risk and Insurance Center at the Ludwig-Maximilians Universität München. During his stay he will present his paper "*Optimal Auditing and Indemnification in Insurance Contracting with Costly Falsification*" in the open research seminar "Management and Microeconomics" from the Institute for Strategy, Technology and Organization (Prof. Dr. Tobias Kretschmer) and the Munich Risk and Insurance Center (Prof. Dr. Andreas Richter).
